interested in preparing one for his loving grandson, who had managed to save up just over a thousand dollars from years of being a paperboy. (Do paperboys still exist?) He agreed and set out to find a suitable candidate. This was in the day of snail mail, no Internet or texting, and even long distance phone calls were for important events or family emergencies. I received a letter telling me that he had bought not one, but two cars and would begin assembling mine from the finest bits and pieces from the two of them. I was SO EXCITED!!! Won't I be the envy of my friends driving to school in a top down MGA or MGB! Weeks later I received another letter with a photo of my car in the process of being restored.... What the heck is that! A 1966 MG 1100 Sport Sedan? So where is the sport?

It was delivered in showroom condition, absolutely no detail left unattended. The exterior mirror gloss finish was beige, followed by a red interior with black carpeting. The engine compartment was a thing of beauty, so much stuff fitted so magnificently into a tiny space. Off to the local drive-in church parking lot to learn how to drive, with Granddad providing the tutelage. Clutch operation came naturally to me, and downshifting was just pure fun! Having never driven a car before, I thought all cars handled like my little 1100. Taking a 90 degree turn at 25 mph was surefooted, however it raised the eves of the folks stopped at the intersection. I finally got my driver's license 5 months later when I turned 16. Yes, perhaps I was driving around with only a learner's permit for a while, but I was a safe driver.... mostly. There was the time out at the lake driving at night, at speeds perhaps above normal, when suddenly the road ended and the lake began. She entered the water like a duck and skipped on the surface a bit only to find out that my little MG floats! With front wheel drive she turned around and I did not even get my feet wet.

I kept my 1100 until my early 20s and then sold it so that I could get a convertible – a 1976 Fiat Spider 124. It wasn't until many, many years later that the MG bug would once again rise up and bite me. Perusing through local Craigslist ads, I happened across a 1965 MG 1100.... Hmmm, it sure would be fun to have another one of those! She was sitting under a huge oak tree in Campo when I first laid eyes on Alice, as she would come to be known. She had been resting there under that canopy of nature for 17 years. Not knowing what I was getting myself into, I offered up my \$400 and she was mine! A year later she was completed. There was no engine or transmission work required, as all she needed to run was a new set of points and new fuel lines, plus hundreds and hundreds of hours of love were required to bring her back to her former self.

Although still a blast to drive daily, she did lack horsepower, which led me to begin the search for an MGB. As I am 6' 2" tall, I realized that my view driving a roadster would be right about the top of the windscreen, so I elected to hunt for an MGB-GT to take advantage of the higher windscreen. Kelley was found and so began her resuscitation. A girlfriend interfered with progress, but she was eventually removed from the picture so that more time could be spent alone with Kelley in the garage. My 1968 MGB-GT was complete in 18 months and I could finally see what 95 BHP could really do! Oh no, bad transmission, egad! Let's go get my GT a new transmission and hit the road. Finally, power with an MG badge! Boy, it sure would be nice to have overdrive with this car.... Let's do that engine/transmission pull thing yet again. All back together, let the fun begin! What's that...? I forgot to change the front tranny oil seal; let's do that pull thing once more. At last! Power and great cruising speed without high revs. But I still don't have an MG roadster.... I know, let's add an MGA to the stable. Soon Marilyn would cause my other MGs to be banished from the garage. Her body has been repaired with new structure prior to being removed from the frame. The frame has been blasted and painted and all new suspension bits are assembled. Once she gets her wheels put back on, the body will get all the attention. I named her Marilyn because of her beautiful curves. With luck she will be completed by Thanksgiving Day. It has only taken 40 years for me to finally realize my dream of owning a MG Roadster. If Granddad had offered up an MGA in the first place, I would have missed out on all the fun of restoring and driving these wonderful cars. Thanks Granddad!

NAMGBR MG 2017

The North American MGB Register (NAMGBR) will be holding their next annual convention, MG 2017, in San Diego from June 25-28 at Paradise Point Resort & Spa. Unless you've been to some of the business meetings in the past few months, you may not be aware that the SDMGC will be filling the role of supporting club for this event. NAMGBR has wanted to hold a convention in Southern California for some time. Last year they approached SDMGC to be the host club, but we didn't have the membership support to take on all of the responsibilities, so we declined. NAMGBR then proposed a shared arrangement with us, where they retained overall responsibility, with SDMGC providing local organization and support, to which we agreed.

The big hurdle was to find a venue for the conclave. We provided NAMGBR with a number of suggestions for hotels in the area – some near the water and some in Mission Valley. When NAMGBR received quotes from the properties, sticker shock set in. They discovered that San Diego is a popular place for summer vacation and began to consider other western cities for the convention. Not long after, Paradise Point reconsidered their bid, reengaged with NAMGBR, and came to an agreement.

I agreed to head up the local team and Steve Kirby offered to be my super-assistant. He brings a wealth of experience with such events. We've assembled a team of volunteers and had our first monthly meeting in May. We've made good progress since then. Our first goal was to identify a location for the car show. We suggested to NAMGBR that Embarcadero Park North would be a beautiful spot for this and NAMGBR has made the arrangements for this. Bryson Pennoyer is in charge of the planning for the car show and will be looking for volunteers to help with the setup and operation of it.

Our second goal was to find a location for the Monday evening off-site group dinner; something that screamed SAN DIEGO! We initially looked at a Hornblower Cruise or a catered dinner on the Midway, but these proved to be too expensive for our group. Ruth Hoffman took on the task and found Old Town's Guadalajara Grille to be ready, willing, and able to provide a wonderful meal within our cost parameters. To make the evening more than just a dinner, Steve Kirby has made arrangements with a local company to provide open double-decker buses to ferry the attendees from Paradise Point to Guadalajara Grille, then, after dinner, take us on a highlight tour of San Diego. With a stop at the Embarcadero, cruise through Balboa Park, drive over the Coronado Bridge, swing by the Hotel del Coronado, and return to Paradise Point, it should make for a wonderfully memorable evening.

Bob Bauer is putting together four guided drives for our visitors: an urban ramble, a coastal tour, Fort Rosecrans/Point Loma Lighthouse, and a backcountry excursion. We also plan to have a variety of self-guided drive instructions to let people explore on their own. If you'd like to help Bob plan out drives or verify routes, please let him know.

Andy Lincoln is in charge of acquiring items for our silent and live auctions and he's already on the hunt for items. If you have something to donate, don't hesitate to get in touch with him. Mary Davidson is in charge of setting up the silent auction and 50/50 raffle. She will definitely need help as we get closer to June.

The majority of car enthusiasts at these events are the guys. Their dedicated wives/girlfriends attend, but have scant interest in things automotive. Renee Neale has taken on the task of expanding the typical tech sessions to include greeting card making, jewelry design, painting, and a session for novices. Mark Wilcox is developing plans for a fashion show of sun-safe clothing. Miles Warren has volunteered to put together some activities to entertain any children who come. You get the picture. We want everybody to have a great time.

President, Jay Flynn, called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm
