I was unashamedly asked by the Editor, as a new member, if I could write a brief account of the midweek run held on Thursday January 12. "No problems", I said, so here is my first contribution to "Octagon".

As a remote location worker (I don't like the term "FIFO") and new member of the MGCCWA (I joined December 2016), this was my first opportunity to meet some fellow enthusiasts, their partners, and of course their cars.



As one of the few member's without an MG (yet!), my approach to this event I was to see if I could "get a ride" with a member who had a spare seat. I saw this as a great way to get to know one of the fellow members.

Richard Gusterson sent out a group email, but unfortunately there were no solid offers prior to the event. That being said, I did get a call from "Canadian Pete" the day before saying he would love to offer me a ride, however his wife wanted to attend (and most MG's only have 2 seats!). Both Richard and Peter suggested I turn up on the day and see what happens.

I brought my "daily driver" to the Repco car park at 07:30 and was surprised to see a number of members already in attendance. I walked up and introduced myself to the group.

The first thing that struck me was how friendly everyone was – they all welcomed me with open arms. From that moment on I knew I had joined a wonderful club, and I was in for a great day out.

Thankfully the pre-dawn showers had cleared to a lovely sunny day, and by 08:00 there must have been about 25 cars and nearly 50 people ready to set off to Jarrahdale. Prior to departure I was kindly offered a seat in two different cars, and I found myself accepting a lift with Ken Rose (another new member) in his 1974 red MGB.





As far as I can recall, this was to be my very first ride in an MG motor car.

PACE NOTES

Brendon Hagarty



Welcome to the 2017 competition year. I last filled this position in a committee way back in 1997. Hard to believe 20 years have passed by – it seems like yesterday! Since the early 2000's I haven't been very involved in MGCC activities, only attending the occasional general meeting, club run and the annual Safety Fast run on a few occasions. My spare time during this period was largely occupied by preparing and racing my Nissan turbo powered MGB in sports car events at Barbagallo Raceway.

Following completion of the build of a fast road MGB (the 3rd MGB in my stable) in time for last year's Natmeet and then doing a couple of other club events in the car (Eric the Half a Bee) I was "encouraged" by several members of the 2016 committee to take on the Comp Sec role this year. I didn't really envisage becoming involved again at this level as I find myself always in a position of "time deprivation" due to a demanding work role and I still have unfinished business in motor racing with the Turbo 'B and another historic clubman car currently undergoing restoration. But given I have accepted the role I will give it the commitment it deserves.

Firstly, I would like to thank Rami and his predecessors in the comp secretary position for maintaining an active competition focus and providing interesting and challenging events for member enjoyment. My aim as I embark in the role is to continue to assist the Club to provide a varied and challenging year of competition events with, hopefully, something for everyone and every MG. I would also like to resurrect some

of the traditional events and awards that have fallen away over the years.

I have put together a draft calendar of events outlined below.

I also intend making contact with the TSOA (Triumph Club) to support their supersprint events by including at least one of these in the calendar.

Information on events will be provided along with entry documentation as each one approaches.

Our first event, the Show'n'Shine is rapidly closing up on us. This year it returns to the Riverside Gardens venue in Bayswater. As this is one of the premier events on the annual club calendar, and also one of the most labour intensive, we need your support by volunteering to help out with the running of the event on the day. There are a number of roles we need to fill including a panel of judges, gate, entry and parking marshals, security/crowd controllers (yes really! A condition of the venue hire) and a results scorer.
