President's Piece

As you may know by now, some minor changes have been made to the member fees and the Club Bylaws. The changes to the fees were made to simplify the list of member categories to just two and to clarify the position of member dependents. Due to the requirements of our new Constitution which introduce a new class of Associate was agreed last year, we have had to Member, known as Junior Members, for under 15-year-old children of existing ordinary /pensioner members. We have also clarified the position of CAMS Public Liability Insurance for passengers in club members cars, when on Social runs or other social events. To be covered by the CAMS Insurance Policy the passenger must be a Club Member. Thus, we have added the words, Spouse/Partner and if applicable, children under 21 Years of age, to the class of Therefore, we politely request all 'Member' and 'Pensioner Member'. members who regularly have the same person as a passenger to advise the Membership Secretary of the name of that person. If on an event, you carry as a passenger a person whose name has not been notified to the club, please ensure that that person's name is entered on the event Attendance Register.

The club is still looking for a volunteer to step forward and take on the role of Social Coordinator, on the Committee. It is not an onerous task but a post that we need to fill ASAP. Basically, the post entails administering the Social activities of the club. It is a Committee position and the occupant is expected, if possible to attend the monthly meetings, that are held on the 1st Tuesday of each month at the clubrooms. Production of some short notes about the months Social Activities, for display in the Octagon and on the website, is the other principle requirement. Assistance will be given to the Volunteer, by the past coordinator and other Committee members. If you consider that you might wish to take on the role, please contact me.

The Saturday morning 'Garage' meeting in December was an unqualified success, with a very good member turnout. Thanks to Mike Smith for organizing and to Tav, for hosting the morning at his premises. The event will be repeated later this year. Most of our MG's are relatively easy to maintain, with simple electronics and SU carburettors, which once set up correctly are extremely

reliable. The introduction of the MGF in 1995 took MG's into the 'electronic age' with 'ECU's' exhaust Catalyser's, etc. This year my TD will be 65 and it is still going well. How many modern cars will reach 20 let alone 50+.

Regrettably the electronics and computers will probably have failed on them well before that. It appears that 2018 car electronics are designed to be good for about 7 to 9 years! In contrast the MG Car Club will be 90 years old on 12th October 2020 and at 88 is now one of the oldest and largest world-wide single marque car clubs. So be proud to be a member of the MGCC of WA.

Below is a simple skeleton of the elements involved in designing a run. Detail, with much more support and encouragement is freely available to all members volunteering!

- 1. Choose Destination
- 2. Choose Starting Point
- 3. Choose Route Using a Map
- 4. Drive the Route with "Navigator" to Record Details.
- 5. Choose Route Instructions Format
- 6. Create Draft Instructions
- 7. Check Drive the Route 1 Week before Event
- 8. Print Final Route Instructions
- 9. Attend Event/Short Briefing of Drivers
- 10. Distribute Route Instructions

Arranging a CAMS permit via President or Social Co-ordinator (Volunteer urgently required for the latter position!) and completion of Event Attendance Forms are a couple of formalities, plus ensuring your run receives good promotion via the Octagon and our Website.

A good suggestion is to team up with a fellow Club mate and organise a run jointly.

In itself, there is a lot of satisfaction to be enjoyed being an organiser and contributing personally to your Club plus connecting with other members is good too.

Categories will suit older or newer cars and one or two drivers per car, driver and passenger and a Touring class for those who wish to take it a bit easier Something to suit everyone!

Uniquely, the event is designed to have several categories:

- I. a single driver,
- two drivers sharing a car (each drives) every competition stage),

a driver and a non-driving passenger,

4. a Touring category, which aside from the Motorkhanas, drive the closed-road stages spiritedly in a group behind a pace car. These choices allow for a wide mix of competitive interests among participants and their codrivers and passengers.

Importantly, the West Cape Classic does not require race suits, roll cages or equipment of more serious rallies. As a Touring Road Event, Level 2 Speed (L2S) competition licenses are required, helmets, long sleeve clothing, a first aid kit and fire extinguisher - so anyone can use their car without modifications.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING/ GENERAL MEETING

16 January 2018: Minutes

Meeting opened at 20.00pm.

Club President in the chair. Visitors: Wayne McCullough / Cameron Mart/ Peter Dover

Apologies: Patrick Reed, Maxine Robbins, Ernie & Lynn Whitehurst.

Special general meeting - purpose of meeting to amend membership details on documents.

Calling notice was circulated at the end of last year to all members, to amend the clubs bylaws by deleting all reference to family members, plus previous single/family member will merge into one category know as ordinary members (language from the Department of Transport).

Constitution will also change to incorporate junior member (under 21 years of age and over the age of 15 years)

as associate members. Members and pensioner members, partner names must be provided to the club, under clause 7.
