MG have just launched a new SUV model, the HS in China & the UK. It is an upgrade on the existing GS model, which will be marketed in the rest of the world, as the HS but indications are that MG Australia will continue with the GS name. All models in the range have a 1.6 litre Turbo engine, delivering 162 PS. However, it may not be available in Australia until early next year.

We are coming to the end of the current Membership year of the club and membership subscriptions for 2020 will be due on the first of January. Port Denison Foreshore Sprint 29th September 2019

4 hours north of Joondalup lies a sleepy little town called Port Dennison. It's a few kms from Dongara on the coast. Usually on a public holiday weekend people from Perth make the journey there to enjoy a relaxing time doing some camping and fishing.

However, over the long weekend in September the town comes alive to the roar of engines as it hosts the now annual foreshore sprint organised through Bruce Pollock of the TOSA and the Shire of Irwin. This was the fourth year of running the event and it is increasing in significant momentum. A very impressive mix of highly desirable cars gathered allowing for lots of opportunity for proud owners to have a chat. In order to compete in this historic sprint cars must have been manufactured prior to 1985.

This year included 1966 Ford Falcon XP owned and built by Michael Vanzetti, unfortunately he hit a barrier on his first drive but luckily managed to replace the wheel and continue for his second run. His grandson Taj, 14 years old, drove his speedway car round the course as a demo. a wonderful example for young drivers.

Amongst the many competitors was a very fast Andy Carrick in his MK1 blue Escort. He completed the course by driving most of it sideways, highly entertaining for the crowds.

John Webb drove his black Porsche 911 and managed the quickest run of the day. Kevin Donovan drove his Mini powered by a 998cc Yamaha R1 fuel injected 6 speed gear box.





Andy Hamilton showed us what his newly built Triumph Sedan with performance enhancements was made of. Craig and Vicky Saywell shared their Mazda RX3 with its

twin cylinder 1308cc rotary engine and put in some fast times.

Trying to limit numbers to 50 was impossible with so much interest so this year there were 53 competitors.

Dare I say there

were 2 ladies driving in the event sharing cars with their husbands; sadly I was not one of them.' The 2.4kms course commenced down Point Leander Drive, through 2 chicanes', down past the obelisk round the turning circle the wrong way then back through the car park turning right in the middle of the car park and back down past the obelisk a second time then back down Point Leander Drive again towards the end of the car park and coming to a complete stop in the 'garage'. There were no classes or fastest time awards but all competitors received а commemorative medallion.

taking our Green 1964 B for its paces and managing to keep the head gasket intact. Having competed last year Peter said, 'never again' and here he is again driving this year! Each car had a practice lap then 3 timed laps through the day.

MY MG-TD John G McCallum

When I was a young teenager, there was a red open wheel car that used to come down our twin roads in Brunswick Junction, and I always thought that it would be a great feeling to own a car that the roof came down allowing the wind to blow through your hair (I had plenty then).

Maybe my thoughts were that I should buy one when I could afford an open top sports car because the noise it made before you saw it was truly and experience to be hold.

About 2 years ago my wife, a friend of my wife and I went to the Curtain FM car show at TRINITY oval to have a good look at OLD cars.

As we passed a green MG we noticed a sign on the front of the vehicle with the words "MG for sale". I stopped to talk to the owner for a couple of seconds before an "overseas person" interrupted our conversation and talked over me asking how much it was and he would like to buy it and take it back to the OLD DART.

I walked away and my wife asked if I liked the car and if I did I should go back and speck to the owner (when the other person had left) and as most of you know, you don't argue with the "Trouble and Strife".

I when back and we spoke for some time saying that I was interested in the purchase of his MG TD and I would contact him over the next couple of days if the other "overseas person" hadn't.

Its history now that I did purchase my new toy (I also have a 1962 Modified EJ Holden) and drove it home and within a couple of weeks I had stripped it to the bare sub frame at which point my thoughts were "how was I going to rebuild it" knowing my interest was mainly in Holden cars.

Well, over 2 years I have had the car it has been a joy to work on knowing that every nut, bolt and washer were replaced with Stainless Steel parts and all rubbers, gaskets and copper washers were all replaced with original parts obtained either in Australia or overseas using Moss motors in London or Manchester.

The frame and total body were sand blasted by AUTOBLAST in Myaree, the body and paint were done by Romano's in Willetton (they don't do classic cars, it's just that I'm very good friends with the owner) the engine and gear box were rebiult by a very good friend in Ray Penfolds who used to work at Auto Classics and he remembers seeing this car on the show room floor back in the 80s. The inside of the cab was re done by myself except the hood and seats which still have to be done.

The colour of the car is BRUNSWICK GREEN and the reason for this is that at Bunnings they have spray cans of BRUNSWICK GREEN, so any painting that Romano's didn't do such as stay bars on the radiator or small items I could do this and the paint colour was a perfect match.

The chrome work was done by a company in Maddington and it was a good thing I gave him plenty of time to do the job as his first quote on "time" was 3 months and ended up close to 9 months.

The number plates are from the original Auction sale way back in the 80s and the owner of Auto Classics brought a number of them including BMW MG etc and they are now a valued item as there are a very saleable item that can be auction off if one so needs extra money.

There have been some added safety items such Brake Booster, Indicators, extra L.E.D brake light centred in the spinner of the spare tyre (this is an added bonus as people tell me they see the centre light as the ones on the mudguard are to low and as I'm on my way to Europe shortly, I'm going to purchase LED globes for all lights to make it much safer for "rubber necks" looking at my car and failing to brake to hopefully see a brighter stop lights All electrical wire was replaced with heaver wire and harnessed in conduit showing very little wires other than those coming out of the harness.

The original wheels of the TD were solid steel and the company had add-on wire wheels for the American market and you can purchase remakes from England but I came across a company in Sydney called Classis Wheels and they supplied me with a complete set including the hubs and spinners for a very reasonable price.

I have since found out that the car was made on or about 21st of November 1950 but can't find out where it went to from there. It would have gone to a right-hand drive country such as South Africa New Zealand or Australia but the company that did all the export either lost or destroyed all records. There is a better than 50% chance it came to Australia as it would seem unlikely to be shipped from South Africa to Australia for sale.



As most of you are aware, it is purely the love of the old cars that make you do silly things such as not adding up the cost of parts, painting, motor, gear box etc that makes it all worthwhile.

I do have all the receipts for all the parts etc but have not had the time or the inclination to attempt to add them up and even if I did it would give my good wife more scope to buy more cloths etc with the added bit of

It is a really great car to drive and I enjoy the looks it gets when ever we go out for a Sunday drive.


