A Chat with Greg Ellis

The legendary Greg Ellis will be well known to many members of the Tasmanian MG Car Club. He joined as an inaugural member in 1959, had a break for his children's school activities and sports, then re-joined the Club in the early 2000's.

Greg's interest in cars and speed stemmed from his father who raced motor bikes. Greg has had many every day cars but the cars he remembers fondly and treasured are the Ford Anglia Tourer (his first car), Morris Minor 1000, Austin Healey Sprite, MGA 1600, MG 1300 and Jaguar Mark V. Greg owned the last three of these simultaneously, but his wife Carol said one had to go and Greg wisely (albeit reluctantly) sold the MG 1300 (pictured below).





Motor Sports records of the early 1960's reveal the often mentioned name of Greg Ellis and, more particularly, a pace setting Morris Minor 1000 a potent Minor which left a solid mark on the motor racing scene. Greg had his first race at Baskerville in 1959, and the first competition at Grass Tree Hill in January 1960.



The 1963-1964 racing seasons saw Greg behind the wheel of an equally potent Austin Healey Sprite, which untuned finished 8th in the Baskerville Sports Car Championship.



Greg is best known for driving his historic MGA. In the early 1960's Greg competed in his brother Peter's MGA, perhaps the State's most reliable and consistent place gaining MG. In many years of solid competition the MGA never failed to finish a race due to mechanical failure. Greg's mechanical skills are widely acknowledged and I know first-hand that what Greg doesn't know about MGA's isn't worth while knowing.

Peter bought the MGA new in December 1960. What many of you will not know, was the car was Carnation Red but within 12 months Peter had it resprayed British Racing Green. In 1962, Greg competed in the Standing Quarter at Richmond and raced at Longford and Baskerville from 1963-1966. In 1966, Greg raced the car at Longford racing 23 laps (103 miles) coming second to a Porsche. Peter then retired the MGA from racing and stored it under his house for some 35 years. Greg, hooked on car racing, eventually bought the car from his brother who had kept the car fully registered (although unused) for those 35 years! Greg readied the car for racing in time for the First Historic Meeting at Baskerville in 2009.

Greg has a collection of photographs, memorabilia, handwritten records and notes, and is understandably proud of his racing times and achievements. In 1960, Greg had a 1 minute 19 second lap time at Baskerville and amazingly had very comparable lap times some 45 years later, although he was quick to point out the course layout had been changed. A recorded speed of 100 mph at Longford Revived was another triumph, whilst in 1966 at Longford the MGA was clocked at 111 mph - Greg said it was doing 7000 rpm in top gear and still accelerating. This must have been scary as the speed was achieved with standard tyres and no roll bar. Greg was 27 years old and it was 'pure adrenaline as he had no fear in those days'.

Greg has always been a a passionate car enthusiast and is a regular attendee at many classic car and MG Car Club events in either his historic 1960 MGA 1600 or his classic 1949 Jaguar Mark V which he has owned for 4 years.

All Pre War, T and Y Type MG's.

Continuing with depiction and recording historic Square Riggers although in this case this TC Special, one of a handful built late 50s by Bruderlin and Thomas of Sydney with streamlining the performance clearly in view. Mind you supercharger as 'standard' and in the hands of Brian Bowe certainly boosted that outcome. Some of these pics have been widely published and here collectively. Brought to Tas by Bowe c1960, issues of tune presented including suspension, carby jetting and the single mindedness of a fixed diff at Symmons. Once sorted great success was forthcoming carrying No.132 - Trevallyn Hill Climb Feb '61 38.39s (photo below), standing quarter March '61 at Symmons 16.67. Also at Symmons below leading and victorious in the Sports Car Scratch Race Nov 1961.













Success continued in the hands of Roger Tyson No.128 naturally aspirated, winning 2nd Division Sports Cars c1964, and a quarter time of 18.49. Tony Woodward of Deloraine took over c1967 No.50 competing at Symmons Plains after improvements then required, particularly dual circuit brakes and roll bar. The TC returned to the mainland 1969 and unfortunately to this time no further reference is forthcoming.
