



Prawn & Lemon Sole Herb Terrine (GF)

A prawn and lemon sole terrine with fresh herbs, served with tangy Marie Rose sauce, fresh watercress, and pickled cucumber.

Ham Hock Terrine (GF)

Pressed ham hock, with sweet apple and onion chutney, sunflower seeds, and fresh rocket.

Roasted Parsnip Soup (GF)(VE)

Roasted parsnip soup, finished with a parsnip crisp and a drizzle of fragrant herb oil.

Herb-Stuffed Turkey Escalope (GF)

A delicious turkey escalope, stuffed with classic sage and onion stuffing, served with crispy roasted potatoes, honey-roasted root vegetables, buttered sprouts, and bacon-wrapped chipolatas and rich festive gravy.

Roast Fillet of Salmon (GF)

Roasted salmon fillet with chargrilled courgettes, crushed basil new potatoes, and finished with a rich shellfish bisque.

Spiced Potato and Soybean Tart (GF)(VE)

A festive spiced potato and soybean tart, served with crushed root vegetables, tenderstem broccoli, and a tomato-and red pepper sauce.

Chocolate and Orange Tart (VE)(GF)

A rich chocolate tart with a zesty orange twist, finished with a refreshing passionfruit coulis.

Biscoff Cheesecake

A creamy Biscoff cheesecake topped with caramelised banana and crunchy Biscoff crumb.

Raspberry & White Chocolate Torte (GF)

A raspberry torte with meringue, topped with a raspberry compote and white chocolate pearls.



A group of us met up at the National Museum of Computing, which is a fascinating place to visit, and goes through the history of computing from wartime decoding using amazing (and huge) machines like Colossus, and takes the visitor through the decades with examples of many machines us oldies will recognise such as the Sinclair Spectrum, the BBC Acorn, the first home PCs, computer games like Space invaders – and the iPhone!

It also had one of the 1st ERNIE machines which picked the premium bond winners, it was obviously faulty as it never picked any of my numbers!



Always time to stop and chat

Many of us made the short (but very hot!) walk around to Bletchley Park itself, which has a display of wartime decoding machines, including the famous Enigma Machine. Many outbuildings with equipment and displays outlining the work that was done there from 1939-1945 and onwards.

The main house is open to walk around and see various offices and so on. Someone had moved the snooker table, so we missed out on a game!

The gardens are nice too – as was the ice cream.....

Saturday evening meal was enjoyed with a good number of members present, and with much jollity – the usual raffle too.



Then the Main Day which was Sunday at The Shuttleworth Collection (Old Warden Airfield). There were 42 MGs present and parked up in front of the main hangar- a great sight! MGC Register Weekender @ The Ripon Inn



15 rooms have been reserved for the Register for Friday 15th and Saturday 16th May 2026 at the Ripon Inn, Ripon. Room booking is on a first-come-first-served basis. The deadline for the room rate is 1st March 2026. If any rooms have not been taken by 1st March they will be handed back to the hotel.

1. Double/Twin occupancy £145 Bed & Breakfast per room, per night (price based on classic and superior rooms).
2. Single occupancy £119 Bed & Breakfast per room, per night (price based on standard double rooms).
3. A £30 dinner food allowance can be pre-added to your booking for £25 per person. This offer must be taken out at the time of booking and cannot be added later prior to arrival.
4. Additional night's accommodation can be booked with 15% discount off the hotel's website price for the weekend.

Bookings can be made by calling central reservations on 0191 580360 mentioning MGC Register event. This telephone number is manned Monday-Friday 9am-7pm and 9am-5pm at weekends. A 10% deposit or full payment is required to secure the booking with full payment taken 6 weeks before arrival.

It is anticipated the weekend will consist of a road run plus a visit to an attraction (TBC).

GBCC member Paul Tordoff never really planned to buy an MGC, but after reading an MGOC magazine article about the car in September 2022, it inspired him to try and acquire the actual car in the article, if it ever came up for sale. After looking for many months, he assumed that the car must have been sold privately and had almost given up hope.

Then in July this year, it turned up in Mathewson's auction catalogue. An exceptionally original 1969 MGC roadster

with a 2912cc 6-cylinder engine.

Acquisition and Early Days

Already the proud owner of a stunning green MGB roadster and a regular at GBCC events and car meets, he never intended to sell his MGB, but when the MGC came up it was too good an opportunity to miss. Paul knew that when "Bangers & Cash" TV show recommission or restore the cars, they are carried out to a good standard and the MGC was sent to the MGOC workshop for a minimal recommissioning for the TV show.



Auction Experience

When Mathewson's of 'Bangers & Cash' TV fame listed this MGC for auction, Paul with his wife's support decided to place a bid in lieu of a luxury cruise celebration for his upcoming 'special' birthday in early 2025. The auction took place on 24th July 2024 and Paul submitted an absentee bid for the auction with his maximum amount. When the auction was live, he was travelling and didn't know he was the winning bidder, until he received messages from a number of friends who were watching the auction live, including our editor, Mike.

The car was delivered to his home around two weeks later, followed by the TV crew another two weeks after that with all of the history and paperwork for an interview and follow up for the TV show. The "Bangers and Cash Restoring Classics" featuring Paul's MGC was aired on TV in November 2024, Series 5 Episode 2.



Condition and History

Originally purchased new from S. Plumb & Son in Doncaster on January 6, 1969, for £966.5s.0p plus £297.10s.8p in purchase tax, the MGC has only covered 5300 miles on the clock. It comes with a comprehensive file of MOTs up to 1984, after which it was stored in a garage for 40 years, making it a true survivor/barn find. It still had the original plastic protection over the seats and cross-ply tyres!

Further Enhancements and Use

Recommissioned by The MG Owner's Club with minimal changes as per the TV show's brief, Paul has since fitted electronic ignition, a new water pump, mirrors, speedo cable, and retouched some paintwork while preserving the original finish. He also rewired the driving lights and added pins for a new tonneau cover.

Events and Driving Experience

Paul enjoys participating in events like the GBCC charity drive for Prostate in September and attending classic car meets. He prefers driving the car over entering it in shows, covering between 2,000 and 3,000 miles annually.


